An unaltered Town Hall organ from J.J.Binns's finest period

Sheffield City Hall

Henry Willis III 1932 4/75 NPOR ref: N01130
Probably the last large civic organ by Henry Willis III. Unaltered and retaining original actions.

Christ Church, Birkenhead

Henry Willis 1860 & 1888 3/42 NPOR ref: R01983
Outstanding instrument, retaining 1888 floating lever action.

St Francis de Sales, Liverpool

Hill Norman & Beard 1927 3/24 NPOR ref: N00169
Late example of exhaust-pneumatic action. Case by P. P. Pugin. Hill pipework

St Mary, Glemsford, Suffolk

Forster & Andrews 1877 2/13 NPOR ref: D05581
Typical and complete unaltered Forster & Andrews. Original stencilled front pipes

Unaltered example of "The Old Firm". Distinctive stencilled front pipes

Retained original tonal design and elements of original action when moved from Highbury

St Paul, Oldham

Ernest Wadsworth 1919 3/24 NPOR ref: R01639
Of conservative design and one of the last Wadsworth instruments to be made

Holy Trinity, Southall, Middlesex

Gray & Davison 1896 2/20 NPOR ref: G01888
A late Gray & Davison in largely original condition

Shaftesbury Street Methodist

Charles Goddard 1853 3/29 NPOR ref: T00616
Unusual survivor of a little-known organbuilder

Christ Church, Coggeshall, Essex

Henry Dyer 1902 2/18 NPOR ref: R01390
Imposing instrument by a local organbuilder, with stencilled front pipes

Private residence, Northumberland

Samuel Letts 1805 2/11 (No Ped) NPOR ref: K00232
Originally built for Haggerston Castle. Unaltered tonally.
