## New Awards January 2021

### Grade II\*

#### **Our Lady of Mount Carmel, High Park Street, Liverpool**

Alexander Young, Manchester 19th cent. 2/22

NPOR ref: N00156

A substantial and intact instrument by a regional organ builder of repute. Built originally for another church, it has especially good tonal qualities with notable reed stops.

### Grade II

#### **All Saints, Tuckingmill, Cornwall**

Hele, Plymouth 1876, Heard & Sons, Truro 1913 2/16

NPOR ref: N11302

A largely unaltered example of the work of two West Country organ builders, the 1876 organ being completed in 1913.

#### **St Buryan, St Buryan, Cornwall**

Heard & Sons, Truro 1901 2/22

NPOR ref: N10281

A substantial example of the work of this early twentieth century Cornish organ builder.

#### **St Peter, Wolferton, Norfolk**

Henry Willis 1886 2/9

NPOR ref: N06795

An unaltered instrument by this leading London builder, funded by the then Prince of Wales, with a stop-list by Sir John Stainer.

#### **St Clement, Beaumont Street, Toxteth, Liverpool**

Rushworth & Dreaper 1916 2/20 NPOR ref: R01311

A rare and unaltered example of the early work of this Liverpool organ builder, saved intact from its original St Martin, Sylvester Street, home after the Liverpool blitz of 1942.
